

Appositive Phrases

Notes

- An appositive phrase interrupts the sentence to provide more information
- They describe the noun or pronoun they are placed next to, often giving more vivid details
- Appositive phrases usually come after the noun they describe but can sometimes come before it

Example Sentences

1. The little boy, a chocolate-covered toddler, asked his mom for some milk.
2. My phone, an iPhone 6, got shattered when I dropped it on the pavement.
3. John Green, the author of *The Fault in Our Stars*, is also well-known for his youtube videos.
4. Odysseus cleverly blinded the Cyclops, the one-eyed giant son of Poseidon.
