**Explanation:** A digraph is a single sound, or <u>phoneme</u>, which is represented by two letters. In digraphs, consonants join together to form a kind of consonant team, which makes a special sound. For instance, *p* and *h* combine to form *ph*, which makes the /f/ sound as in *phonemic*.
