The genre for this month is **biography**. Read a biography about a person you are interested in. This may be a person from history or present day. Include the following in your talk:

Introduction

- Introduce your book...make it catchy!!!
- Title
- Author
- Genre
- Reason why you chose this particular book

Main Topic

- Orally describe the subject/person of the book with supporting details. Why is this person important?
- What are some interesting facts that you have learned? Tell at least 3 important facts.

Body:

- How does the story/person's life begin? (Refer to your timeline)
- What happens? (What are the important dates? Refer to your timeline)
- Be sure to give a complete summary of the main events in the story/person's life.

Recommendation

- Use a scale of 1-10 to rate the book that you read.
- Would you recommend this book to anyone? Why or why not?
- What did you learn from this book?
- How can you apply what you have learned to the future?

Please choose one of the following two choices:

- 1. Read aloud a passage from the book, prepare your audience for the reading by explaining why you chose this particular passage. Why is it important to the person's life?
- 2. Share connections you made with the book?
 - Text to text (Is there another book that reminds you of this book?)
 - Text to self (Does any part of the book apply to you?)
 - Text to world (Is there anything happening in our world that applies to this book?)

Prepare your talk on note cards to practice with and/or use during your book talk (these will not be turned in). A written summary of the book you read and complete timeline of the person's life are due the same day the book talk is scheduled.
