

PEER TO PEER:

The Peer to Peer Program is underway. This program is desianed to assist students with social disabilities to function socially and gain independence using peer support. If your child likes to help others, wants to know more about various disabilities such as Autism Spectrum Disorder or just wants to make new friends, consider signing them up. MEDICATION

Please note that students are not permitted to self-administer prescription or over the counter medications during school hours. If your physician has determined that medication has to be taken during the school day, a Medical Authorization Form, available in the office, must be completely filled out and signed by both the Eligible students should have physician and the parent. The form and medication must be submitted to the office. Your child must report to the office to receive their medication. This policy of the Dearborn Public Schools is in accordance with General School Law (Section 380.11780).

CELL PHONES

Dearborn Public Schools policy on cell phones is that they cannot be seen or heard. We discourage students from bringing them to school. The school rule is that if a phone is brought to school, it must be turned off and locked in the locker until 2:55 p.m. Students may not use their phones inside the school. Phones may only be used after school and outside of the building.

School personnel will not be responsible for lost or stolen phones. If a cell phone is seen or heard, it will be confiscated and returned only to a parent on the following day. The second time a cell phone is confiscated will result in a detention and a parent/guardian retrieving the cell phone on the following Monday. If a student is caught using a cell phone or if the cell phone rings in class, the cell phone will be confiscated and returned the following Monday to a parent or guardian. Repeated offenses may result in further discipline.

BICYCLE SECURITY

Students must lock up their bikes in the racks on the north side or south side of the school. It is recommended that bicycles be secured with a strong cable and lock.

BUS INFORMATION

received a postcard from our Transportation Department telling them where they should wait for their bus and the pick up time. Students should make a point to learn their bus

number and their driver's face. This makes it much



easier to find the bus at dismissal time.

Riding the school bus is a privilege. Students are expected to behave as young adults on all buses. Students who misbehave will face a range of consequences including loss of riding privileges. All questions regarding transportation should be addressed to the Transportation Department at 827-3300.

TEXTBOOKS

Parents can help students avoid end of the year fines, which can amount to a great deal of money, for damaged and lost texts by doing the following:

1. Periodically go over each textbook with your child to examine and check for damage. This also shows the child that you will be monitoring his /her progress carefully. It is recomended that books be covered. 2. Do make sure that your

child's name is written in the place provided on the inside of the cover with the teacher's name. This will help us get lost books back to the student auickly.

3. Do remind your child not to lend their books to friends as he/she are responsible for the book that they have been assigned.

ATHLETIC/ ACADEMIC FEES

To participate in athletic or academic after school activities, middle school students must pay the following fees:

Fees:

- \$45 per academic activity
- \$75 per athletic activity
- \$100 per student for athletic AND academic
- \$300 per family

These fees were approved by the Dearborn Board of Education as part of a strategy to balance the budget. Participation requires the above fees to be paid before the activity begins. For those in financial need, parents may apply for a waiver through the Business Office of the Dearborn Public Schools.

Northwestern University's Midwest Academic Talent Search offers seventh and eighth students the opportunity to experience the ACT and SAT exams during their middle school years. Students are selected to participate based upon their high achievement on last year's MEAP in reading and/or mathematics.

The qualifying scores are:	Reading	Mathematics
Seventh Graders (Grade 6 MEAP scores)	661 or higher	658 or higher
Eighth Graders (Grade 7 MEAP scores)	755 or higher	755 or higher

Students who take an above grade-level test through NUMATS are able to:

Practice taking the test before it really counts.

Compare their abilities to other academically talented participants as well as high school students.

Receive suggestions for academic planning and extracurricular activities.

Gain access to enriching summer camps and other educational opportunities.

On October 15, Mr. Renko will give students who met the criteria set by NUMATS the required registration information and MEAP performance scores. Qualifying students may register online or pick up an application from the counseling center. The paper registration must be postmarked by October 30.

School Bus Safety Week is October 18 – October 22, 2010



It is a great time to remind students about bus safety:

- \emptyset Be on time to your bus stop 5 minutes early is best.
- Ø Wait for the bus in a safe spot not in the street. Respect the property where you wait.
- Ø Don't run to the bus. Wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and the driver opens the door.
- Ø Never run after a school bus there are too many blind spots around a school bus.
- Ø Use the handrail.
- Ø Be careful not to wear clothing with long drawstrings.
- Ø On the bus stay seated, talk quietly, pack in your lap, and hands to yourself.
- Ø Never put anything out a school bus window.
- Ø Never play with emergency equipment, including windows and doors.
- Ø Getting off the bus wait for the bus to come to a complete stop, wait your turn, and no pushing.
- Ø Off the bus move away from the bus, stay in clear view, and never reach under the bus to retrieve anything.
- Ø If you have a question or problem please speak with the bus driver.
- Ø Be smart, be alert, and be safe.
