









It takes a half hour to watch most of your favorite T.V. shows.








The minute hand is the long hand on a clock. It shows the minutes.







The hour hand is the short hand on the clock. It shows the hours.




Directions: Cut out and laminate the cards. Pages I2-I4 are time to the hour cards. If you are teaching kindergarten or are reviewing time to the hour, you might want to have students start playing with these cards. The cards on pages I5-I7 are time to the half hour. In first grade, I mix both sets of cards together. Ask students to place the cards face down. Students will turn over two cards at a time. If the two cards match, the student will get to keep them and go again. Whoever has the most cards at the end is the winner.






Telling time to the Half Hour Memory (ards)

Kim woke up at 6:00 a.m. Her brother woke up 3 hours later. Her mom woke up 2 hours before her brother. What time did Kim's mom wake up? At 6:00 a.m. there are 10 butterflies in the garden. At 7:00 a.m. there are 20 butterflies in the garden. At 8:00 a.m. there are 30 butterflies in the garden. What time do you think it will be when there are 40 butterflies in the garden?

It takes the chicken 5 hours to lay 20 eggs. How many eggs does the chicken lay per hour?



The horse can run 6 miles an hour. How many hours will it take for the horse to run 42 miles?
