SENTENCE CAPTURE

Choose a sentence from the text that stood out for you, and that supports the BIG idea from the text. Explain your thinking.

EMOTIONS

Explain what fascinates you in regard to the topic from the text. What do you find troubling or controversial about the topic?

VISUAL THINKING

 Choose a color that you feel represents the big idea from the text. 2) Draw a symbol that you feel portrays the main idea of the text. Explain your thinking for each choice.

VIEWPOINTS

Brainstorm all the different viewpoints, or perspectives, present in the text. Viewpoints can come from real characters or from objects like a tree.

VOCABULARY

Pick 4-5 vocabulary words that either you don't know the meaning of or are important to understanding the text. Complete a Frayer Model Card for each word.
