Poetry Worksheet #1

Symbol= an object or a word that represents an abstract idea. An action, person, place, word, or object can all have a symbolic meaning. When an author wants to suggest a certain mood or emotion, he can also use symbolism to hint at it, rather than just blatantly saying it.

Allusion= a figure of speech whereby the author refers to a subject matter such as a place, event, or literary work as passing reference. It is up to the reader to make a connection to the subject being mentioned.

Metaphor= an implicit, implied or hidden comparison between two things or objects that are different from each other, but have some characteristics common between them.

Alliteration= occurs when a series of words in in close proximity to each other have the same first consonant sound. For example, "She sells sea-shells down by the sea-shore" or "Peter Piper Picked a Peck of Pickled Peppers" are both alliterative phrases.

Hyperbole= exaggerations to create emphasis or effect, not meant to be taken literally. "I could eat a horse."

Personification=the attribution of human nature or character to animals, inanimate objects, or abstract notions.
