buds (<i>n.</i>)	leaves or flowers that have not yet opened (p. 8)
bulbs (<i>n.</i>)	underground parts of some plants that are used to store food (p. 6)
dandelion (<i>n.</i>)	a common, wild plant with yellow flowers (p. 13)
gophers (<i>n.</i>)	rodents that dig and have large cheek pouches (p. 13)
shoots (<i>n.</i>)	new stems or branches (p. 6)
water lily (<i>n.</i>)	any of a group of water plants whose leaves and flowers float on the water (p. 15)
wiggly (<i>adj.</i>)	moving quickly back and forth (p. 7)
