#### Bill to Lower Athlete Pay

#### Bill to Implement APAC Prison in the United States

- 1. Be it enacted by this Congress here assembled that:
- 2. Section I: One half of all federally funded prisons in the United States shall be
- 3. converted into an APAC prison.
- 4. Section IIa: An APAC prison shall be defined as a federally funded prison in which there are no
- 5. guards or weapons, with three sections: a closed section with inmates being semi-supervised
- 6. and they work on a basic trade, a semi-closed section with inmates able to walk around
- 7. their section unrestricted and able to make products for sale (profits to go to the prison), and
- 8. An open section that allows inmates to leave once a week with a vetted chaperone and can
- 9. have a paying job outside the prison, within a two mile radius of the prison.
- 10. Section IIb: Inmates will start out in the standard prison system. Qualifying inmates will have the
- 11. option to move to a closed section of an APAC prison. Qualifying inmates will then have the
- 12. option of moving to the semi-closed section and then may qualify to move to the open section
- 13. Prison management will have authority to move an inmate to a lower section, if warranted.
- 14. Section III: This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2020.
- 15. Section IV: The United States Bureau of Prisons is responsible for the enforcement of this bill.
- 16. This bill will be funded with half the budget for prisons. Any additional necessary funding
- 17. will be taken from the defense budget, capping at 1%.
