


What are the four kinds of sentences?

A declarative sentence makes a statement and ends with a period.

An interrogative sentence asks a question and ends with a question mark.

An imperative sentence gives a command and ends with a period.

An exclamatory sentence shows excitement or strong emotion and ends with an exclamation point.
