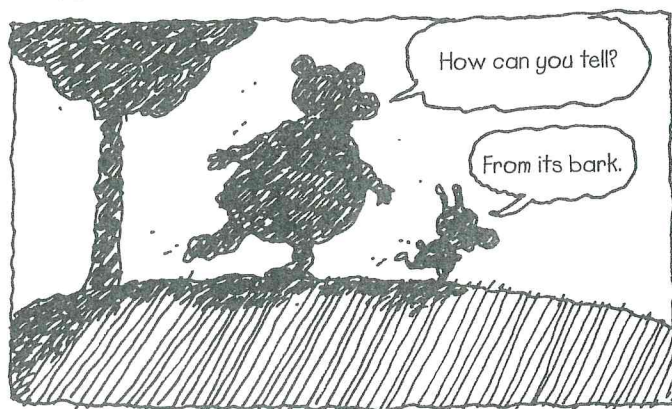
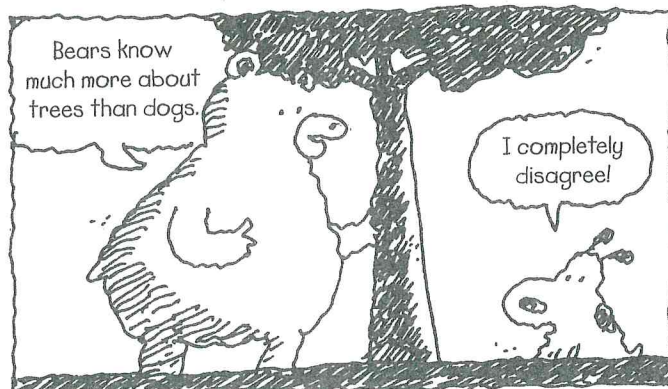

- An **exclamatory sentence** shows excitement or strong emotion and ends with an exclamation point.
