

Henry Ford Early College School Profile

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Henry Ford Early College is a unique program that is a part of the Dearborn Public School system. It is a five year high school that is accredited by the North Central Association. The current enrollment is about 220 students in grades 9-13. The students represent a diverse population from any school district in Wayne County. The program's emphasis is on Health careers, in cooperation with the Henry Ford Health System and Henry Ford Community College. Courses are offered at all three sites. At the conclusion of Grade 13, the students should receive a high school diploma from Dearborn Public Schools and an Associate Degree from Henry Ford Community College.

Curriculum Highlights

Grade 9 – All six classes each semester are at Henry Ford Early College campus. They include: Language Arts, Math, Biology, Physics, World History and Allied Health and two Science Lab classes at Henry Ford Hospital – Biology and Physics.

Grade 10 – Classes taken at Henry Ford Early College: Language Arts, Math, Chemistry, Anatomy and Physiology and U.S. History. Two college courses: College Success and Medical Terminology. Two Science labs at Henry Ford Hospital: Chemistry and Anatomy & Physiology.

Grade 11 – Classes taken at Henry Ford Early College: Language Arts, Government/Economics, Math, Physical Education. Two college courses at Henry Ford Community College according to student's individual curriculum

Grade 12 – Classes taken at Henry Ford Early College: Language Arts. Four courses at Henry Ford Community College

Grade 13 – All classes taken at Henry Ford Community College following the student's specific Health career curriculum

Academic Profile

Henry Ford Early College awards semester credit. A student's grade point average is computed using a weighted (5.0) scale for their dual enrolled college courses. College credit hours are converted to high school credits: college credit is equal to .25 high school credit.
