## Multi Media Final Project January 2018

Create a slideshow using PowerPoint to describe all of the programs that you have learned in this class.

Programs include *PowerPoint, Publisher, Adobe Fireworks, Adobe Flash and PowToon*.

Presentation should be at least 20 information slides with an introduction slide that includes your name, date, class hour and title to presentation, also a slide that explains the drop off and saving procedure. 22 slides total.

*Slides* should have custom animation on each element. *Animation must be after previous on all elements on all slides.* You should also include *one appropriate image or graphic* to each slide. Slides should be free of spelling errors. Text size and font type must be consistent throughout the presentation.

### Information you must include:

- What the purpose of each program is and what tools you learned how to use. (see each program list below)
- The slides must have *bullet points* and you must supplement your slides with speaker notes to explain what is on each slide. (Your presentation must have your thoughts written down explaining each slide in the speaker notes or you will not receive credit for your PowerPoint.) Example slide:

# Photos and Graphics

- ▶ Keep photos to 1-2 a page
- Don't make the pics to big or small
  - Make sure the pics correspond with the words
  - Stick with the same type of pics you started with

When using twos and graphics in power point you should only have at least 1 or maybe even 2 to a page. When using pictures you have to make them a good state, not to big and not to small wit just right. If your picture is facing one way, you want it be positioned so its pointing at the words. Also, if the picture is animated or if it's a real picture make sure you trick with those types of pictures.

Program 1 PowerPoint: you should explain:

- > Text guidelines--Font size, style, color etc.
- Appropriate use of photos and graphics
- How to add custom animation, make it play on its own
- How to add sound effects

**Program 2 Publisher**: you should explain the following publications and what they should be used for:

- Brochure
- Business cards
- > Flyers
- Menus
  - You should also explain the use of text boxes, images, color schemes, and publication designs

**Program 3 Fireworks**: you should explain what Adobe Fireworks is and what it is used for.

- > You should explain all of the drawing tools and include a drawing.
- You should also explain Photo editing tools used for Collage, Person Collage and Nature Scene.
- > Describe the steps to create the mask.
- You should also include a photo that was created on Fireworks in your slideshow possibly one of your masks.

**Program 4 Flash**: you should explain how you used the tools to create movies.

- > You should include how you added pictures and text.
- How you created symbols
- Explain how and why to use key frames
- Explain how sound was added
- You should also include at least one image from your Flash movies (screenshot of your movie playing, PowerPoint does not allow these file types to play in the presentation)

**Program 5 PowToon**: you should explain how you used the tools to create movies.

- You should explain the difference between the templates and creating a presentation from scratch
- Explain how to add slides to the presentation and how you added all elements to each slide: images, animations and text boxes
- You should include how you uploaded your own pictures
- Also, explain how to make slides longer to show text longer
- Include some images from your PowToon on these slides as well

In one slide, you must also explain the saving and turn in procedure. (How you drop off your assignment in the I: Drive, don't forget how you had to share the Powtoons)

Number of slides must be:

- 1 Slide for introduction
- 4 Slides for PowerPoint
- 4 Slides for Publisher
- 4 Slides for Powtoon
- 4 Slides for Fireworks
- 4 Slides for Flash
- 1 Slide for explaining the saving and drop off procedure
