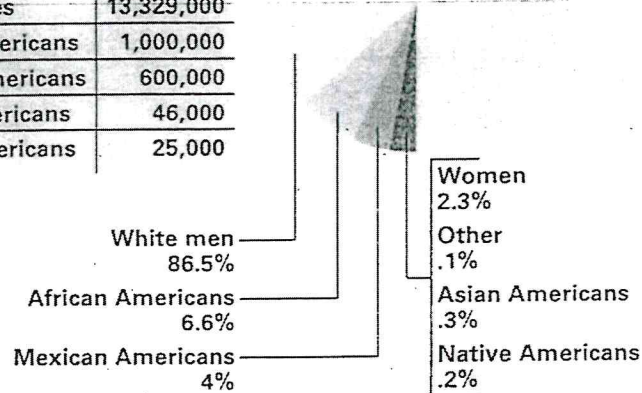


Directions: Use the information in the table and graph and your knowledge of U.S. history to answer the questions.
