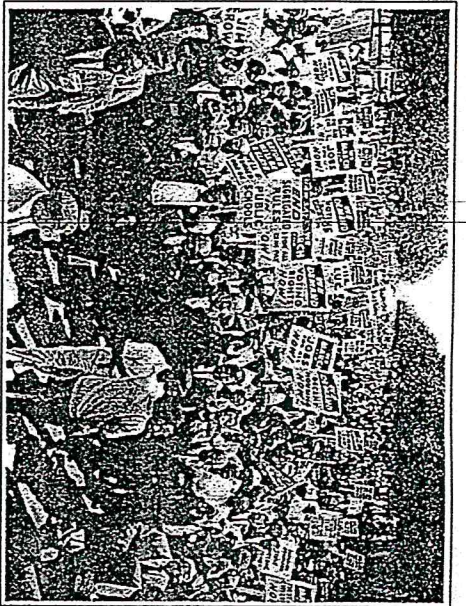


This photograph shows some of the 250,000 Americans who gathered for the March on Washington in August 1963.
