A Nation Divided

Avoiding the War:

- -Looked for lenient draft boards
- -A common way to get a deferment was by enrolling in college, which generally required having money
- -Found doctors to give medical deferments
- -Joined the National Guard or Coast Guard; enrolled in college
- -Nearly 80 percent of U.S. soldiers came from lower economic levels

Opposing the War:

- -Publicly burned draft cards
- -Held antiwar demonstrations in public areas
- -The belief that the war was draining U.S. strength; the belief that the war was immoral
- -New Left organizations
- -Students for a Democratic Society (SDS)
- -College students & the young
- Johnson's revoking college deferments for those not in good academic standing
- -The belief that the war did not concern the U.S.
- -Fled to Canada and Sweden & marched on Washington
- -The Free Speech Movement (FSM)

Defending the War:

- -Supported U.S. involvement
- -Felt that Johnson should escalate the war more quickly
