Expectations for Drop Off and Pick Up

 - We go outside in all kinds of weather conditions as long as it is above 25 degrees F
 - Please provide your child with snow boots, winter jacket, waterproof gloves, snow pants, and a hat for the winter weather.

- ★ Appropriate apparel for preschool activities
 - We partake in a lot of sensory/messy play activities during the day for fun learning experiences.
 - Please send your children in clothes you are okay with them getting messy and extra clothes in case they need to change
- ★ Wear closed toes shoes
