

Big Ideas of Lesson 2, Unit 6

- 1. Popular sovereignty, which means the people hold the power of government, is one of our most important core democratic values.
- 2. Because people hold the power of government they have many civic responsibilities. These responsibilities are connected to other democratic values and principles.
- 3. Because we value justice and the right to a fair trial, citizens have the responsibility to serve on a jury.
- 4. Because we value the rule of law, citizens must respect and obey our laws.
- 5. Because we value the common good, citizens must pay taxes in order for the government to provide services that benefit everyone.
- 6. Because we believe in the principle of representative government, citizens have the responsibility to register to vote and vote knowledgeably.

9 popular sovereignty

the power and authority of the government comes from the people

Example: Popular sovereignty is an important core democratic value.

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10 the common good



people working together for the benefit of everybody

Example: When you help clean up in the classroom you are doing something for the common good.

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11 rule of law



everyone, including the people who run the government, must obey the laws

Example: Communities, states and countries have laws.

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12 justice



another word for fairness

Example: Justice means that people should be treated fairly.

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13 representative government





a form of government where people choose representatives to make decisions for them

Example: In a representative government people elect people to make decisions for them.

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14 civic responsibilities



things citizens are supposed to do

Example: Civic responsibilities include obeying laws, voting and paying taxes.

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15 jury



a group of

citizens who listen to the evidence at a trial and decide if the law has been broken

Example: The jury listened carefully as evidence was presented.

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16 public goods and services



goods and services that are produced by a government

Example: Repairing roads and building schools are examples of public goods and services.

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17 taxes



what people pay to a government in exchange for services like schools and road repair

Example: People pay taxes to a government. Then, the government uses the tax money to do things fix roads.

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18 republic

a government not led by a hereditary rule (leaders based on birth), but where people hold the power of government and choose leaders to make decisions

Example: Our government is a republic.

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19 voting



the way leaders are chosen in our country

Example: Voting knowledgeably is one of our most important civic responsibilities.

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
