Causes of WWI: A Short Play in One Act

<u>Characters:</u> Teacher, Students: #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, Student #1_ Student #2

Teacher: [Speaking to class] Okay, class. We are now going to cover Ch. 29 on World War I.

#7: [Raises hand and starts speaking] The way I see it, there was World War I, right? And before that, there was no war, right? So, there must have been a moment where there not being a war on went away, and there being a war on came along. So, what I want to know is, how did we get from the one case of affairs to the other case of affairs?

Teacher: Do you mean, how did World War One start?

#7: Yeah.

#6: I heard it started when a guy named Archie Duke shot an ostrich 'cause he was hungry.

Teacher: I think you mean it started when the archduke of Austria-Hungary was shot.

#1: _____[Student #2]?

Teacher: Germany! Germany is Austria's best friend. So, if Russia were to attack Austria, Germany would attack Russia. But, this would leave Germany undefended on the western side, and who is Russia's friend west of Germany?

#8: France.

Teacher: Yes, good! So if Germany attacked Russia, she would also have to attack France, since France is friends with Russia.

#3: [Blurts out] Where is France?

Teacher: And if Germany were to attack France, that would leave Belgium threatened.

#3: [Blurts out] Where is "Bell-Jim"?

Teacher: And Belgium and France were Britain's friends, so that means Britain jumped into the fight. It also meant that all of the colonies of these imperial powers jumped into the fight as well. There is your world war.

#3: [Blurts out] So, where is Bosnia again?

#4: So, World War One happened because of that?

Teacher: Yes.
