Population of Western Europe, 650–1340 (in millions)			
Region	650	1000	1340
Spain and Portugal	3.5	7	9
France and the Low Countries	3.5	6	19
Britain	.5	2	5
Germany and Scandinavia	2.0	4	11.5

- Between 1000 and 1340, the population of France and the Low Countries:
 - decreased by 3.5 million people.
 - increased by 13 million people.
 - remained the same.
 - None of the above
- In the year 1000, Britain:
 - had 1.5 million more people than in 650.
 - had more people than France and the Low Countries.
 - the same number of people as Germany and Scandinavia.
 - had 7 million fewer people than Spain and Portugal.
- Between 650 and 1340, the population of Germany and Scandinavia:
 - decreased by more than 9 million people.
 - grew by almost 10 million people.
 - decreased by 7.5 million people.
 - grew by 2 million people.
- Spain and Portugal:
 - had fewer people than Germany and Scandinavia in 1340.
 - had more people than Britain at all three points.
 - had the same number of inhabitants as France and the Low Countries in 650.
