
Population Distribution and Density

Demographers are social scientists who study changes in population and population patterns. Population is the total number of people in a particular area. In the United States, the government counts the population every ten years in what is called the census. Put on your demographer hat and look at the map below based on the 2010 census. 


Figure 5: U.S. Census. Population Density by County.
