9. How can we divide Michigan into 2 regions? - Upper & Lower Peninsula

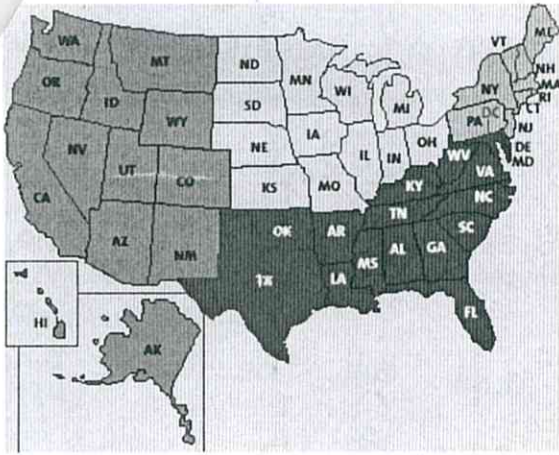
10. What does the map below show us? - The Northern Lower Peninsula has fewer people. Why would the northern lower peninsula have less people than the southern lower peninsula?
