Birds Lay Eggs in Spring

Spring is one of the four seasons. It comes after winter


and before fall.



You will notice many changes that happen in the spring.



The weather gets warmer, melting the snow and allowing flowers and plants to grow.





Birds begin gathering twigs and leaves so that they can build their

nests.





Once they build their nests, they can lay their eggs. These blue eggs were laid by a mother robin.



Birds lay their eggs in spring for many reasons.



Winter's weather is too cold. There is not enough food such as bugs and plants for birds in winter.



Also, birds need to *incubate* their eggs or keep them warm. It is too cold in

winter to do this.



Although the weather is warm enough in summer and fall, birds still choose to lay their eggs in spring.





This is because there is not enough time for the baby birds to grow and develop in

summer and fall.



Baby birds are *helpless* for many weeks. That means that they need their parents to help them survive.



Many baby birds cannot see when they are born.



It takes most baby birds weeks

to learn how to fly.



They also need their parents to feed them.



It takes a long time for baby birds to grow and learn to take care of themselves, so spring is the perfect time for mother birds to

lay their eggs.
