## Ratios on a Field Trip

*Use "A Field Trip to Baltimore" to help you answer the following questions.*

- 1) What is the ratio of Emma's shirts to jeans?
- 2) What is being compared when she mentioned that "kids rule"?
- 3) Mrs. Hancock expresses a ratio to the whole group. What ratio was she talking about?
- 4) What ratio made Sarah, Anna, and Emma nervous? *Write this simplified ratio three different ways.*
- 5) Express a ratio that describes the kids in their actual group.
- 6) What is in Anna's lunch box was an example of a ratio? What is being compared to each other?
- 7) The chaperone took a vote to see who wanted to see the dolphin show. Is this a ratio? Why or why not?
- 8) True or False: The ratio of the mini pool to sting rays is 4 to 1. Explain why.
- 9) Write a ratio for dolphins to the number of trainers, three different ways.
