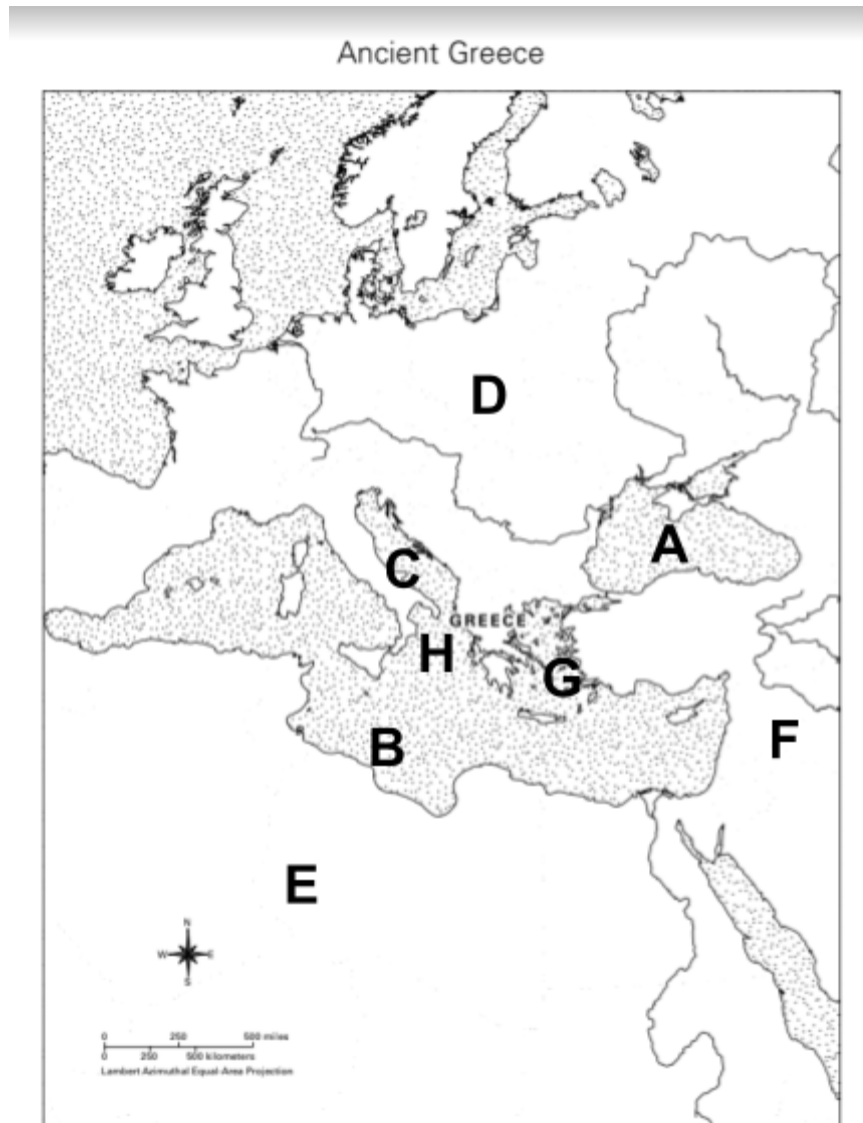


## Chapter 25: Geography of Greece
