Steps for Continued Success

— Encourage your child to:

1. Come to school/class on time. Important learning happens from the start of the bell.
2. Study (review Cornell Notes/vocabulary words/study guides).
3. Make visual vocabulary cards to help them remember/review content.
4. Read for understanding every night (20 minutes or more).
5. Explain to you, what they've learned. If they can explain it, they know it!
6. Work on Khanacademy and/or MobyMax every evening (20 minutes or more).
7. Complete all assignments to their best ability and turn them in on time.
8. Ask the teacher for help if they don't understand.
9. Write all assignments in their planner.
10. Check studentconnect regularly.
