




Salina Techcats Recognized!

TIPS FOR PARENTS

Middle school is a time of change, and most students go through several stages and lots of ups and downs. The tips below will help you guide and advise your middle school student.

- At the beginning of each grading period, sit down with your child and together set realistic academic goals for each class.
- Encourage your child to get involved in school activities. Show your support by attending performances and games.
- Make sure your child knows that you expect him/her to be in school, on time, every day.
- Attend all open houses and parent conferences. Also, regularly check your school's website for information and updates.
- Write down the dates that progress reports and report cards come out. Expect your child to bring them home. If you don't see one, call the school and request a copy.
- One of the biggest challenges for middle school students is being organized. Make sure that your child has a system for recording assignments, taking notes, and keeping his/her backpack organized.
- * Realize that it is your child's responsibility to get homework done, to prepare for tests, and to follow the rules.
- Work together with the school. Teachers, counselors, and principals are there to help your child get the best education possible.
- Make sure that your child is not spending too much time on the phone, on the Internet, watching TV, or playing video games. Set limits.
- Look for opportunities to praise good grades and extra effort.
- ❖ Talk to your child about what's happening in school and be a good listener. If your son or daughter says something about school that concerns you, remember that what you are hearing is form your child's perspective. If you have a question or concern contact the school by phone or e-mail.


