

## Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood

Communication isn't just about speaking effectively, it's also about <u>listening</u> effectively. Some may argue that listening is the most important communication skill of all. And listening doesn't just happen with your ears! According to Stephen Covey, "70-80 percent of all communication is nonverbal" (*The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Families*). Our children, even at a young age, can pick up on body lanuage and tone to learn to be an empathetic listener.

Parents at our February PTA meeting practiced using "the talking stick" to get a feel for what Lindbergh students have been learning about taking turns and actively listening to one another. Once the speaker is decided, the speaker holds the talking stick and has the opportunity to explain his/her issue to the listener. The listener then rephrases what the speaker has said, until the speaker feels understood and respected. This is an easy exercise you can practice at home around the dinner table with your child!
