
1. Authority Tyrant - Leader who abuses their power and is unjust/Government that unjustly uses its power
2. repeal - To take back law or to cancel a law
3. Boycott - To refuse to buy one or more goods from a certain source (It can be organized refusal by many people)
4. protest - Express strong opposition or disapproval of something in the form of a public demonstration (outside, signs with messages of what they dislike)
5. retain - To continue to use (like a law)
6. Authority - Person or group that has power to give orders or to make decisions
7. militia - Small army made up of regular citizens trained to fight
8. violate - The act of ignoring or interfering with a person's right
9. Loyalist - A colonist who supported the king of England
10. Patriot - A colonist who opposed the king of England
11. Ally - Person/group that joins others for a common purpose, such as war
12. Rebel - A person who goes against authority
13. debate - expressing different opinions on an issue in detail
14. impose - to enforce rules from authority
15. principles - values, code of conduct, actions to be good (values such as: honesty and respect)
16. independence - freedom from control by another government or country
17. natural rights - freedoms everyone should have, (freedoms such as life: liberty and the pursuit of happiness)
18. fundamental - basic principles (rules/laws) to create a strong foundation for a system (system such as for governments, business, family, school ...)
19. artillery - heavy guns, cannons
20. traitor - a person who is not loyal towards the government
21. treason - an act of disloyal behavior towards the government
22. benefit - something helpful or useful

- Tyranny - have rulers that are unjust in their use of power over the citizens
- Democracy - officials are elected by the citizens (to represent the citizens)
- Monarchy - ruler is a king or queen, they have complete authority, rule for their lifetime, successor is in the family bloodline (son...)
- Constitutional Monarchy - a king/queen with elected representatives for parliament/congress rule the nation
