READING AT HOME

Support reading as a family:

- Agree to turn off electronics to drop everything and read for at least 20 minutes/night.
- 2. Read together. Talk about books as a family. Listen to books in the car (audio books are amazing!). Read books at bedtime.
- 3. Realize that you WILL get smarter by dedicating reading time at home--have a growth mindset!

Why is Reading at Home Important?

When a student reads 20 minutes a day at home, that student reads 1,800,000 words a year compared to 8,000 words per year for a student who reads one minute or less.

Students who read 20 minutes a day at home also perform 90% better on all content area assessments than their classmates who do not read. Reading as much and as well as you can is a key to your success in school and beyond!

Independent Reading

With the current situation, you will be reading 1 independent book a card marking of at least 250 pages and completing 1 book form about the book.

Choose books that:

- Interest you; not just by lexile
- You can understand
- Are new to you (haven't read before- No, The Giver or Legend)
- Are appropriate for you; comfortable with subject matter/style
- Are suitable for middle school and beyond (no more, Diary of A Wimpy Kid)
- Are not a movie (no, The Outsiders)

You may read more for extra credit as long as they meet the requirements above. If you don't meet the above requirements, they don't count for class. The goal is for you to enjoy reading and grow as a reader!
