Task: Pick a book character that exhibits one of the habits and make a poster

Goal: You will create an eye-catching, creative, characterization poster depicting one main character from a book you have read. Your poster must include the following:

1. An image representing your main character. This does not have to be a picture of your character (although that is okay), it can also be an image that represents your character.
2. The title and author of the book should be written somewhere on your poster.
3. A brief description of your character incorporating their use of one or two of the 7 Habits. Make sure that the Habit you choose is bold and stands out on your poster.
 - Kindergarten: Write 1 sentence about how the character demonstrates or uses one of the 7 Habits
 - 1ST Grade: Write 1-2 sentences about how the character demonstrates or uses the 7 Habits
 - 2nd Grade: Write 2-3 sentences about how the character demonstrates or uses the 7 Habits
 - 3rd Grade: Write 3-4 sentences about how the character demonstrates or uses the 7 Habits
 - 4th Grade: Write 4-5 sentences about how the character demonstrates or uses the 7 Habits
 - 5th Grade: Write 5-6 sentences about how the character demonstrates or uses the 7 Habits
4. One direct quote spoken by your character. This quote should reflect your character's essence or personality and/or how your character feels about himself/herself.
5. 3-5 key adjectives to describe your character.

You may choose the arrangement and design of your poster, so long as it fulfills the requirements of the assignment.

Experiment with font and color, but please make sure that your poster is neat and organized. We will be displaying the posters in hallways all over the school.
