Matt is getting ready for school! The first clock shows when Matt started each activity to get ready. The second clock shows what time he finished. Write how much time has elapsed for each activity.

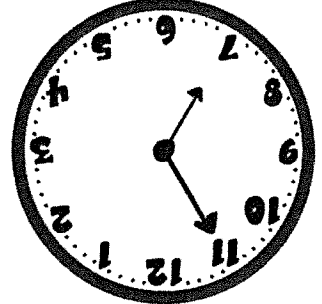
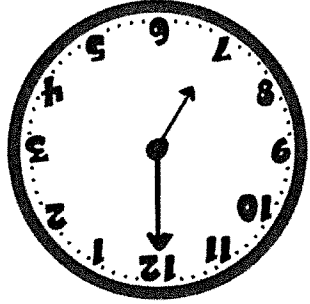
