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### **Class Expectations:** Be Prompt, Prepared, Productive, & Polite

#### **Procedures:**

- 1. Students will be in their assigned seats and prepared to work on time. You must begin your bell work as soon as you sit down. Students may not come to class and ask for a pass to go to the restroom or leave for a drink. Students are expected to make restroom and drink visits during the passing times provided.
- 2. Students will bring the following items daily (no exceptions):
  - 1. Folder with lined paper
  - 2. 2 Notebooks
  - 3. Planner and photo ID
  - 4. Pencil
  - 5. Red pen
  - 6. **2 Thin** dry erase **EXPO** markers
- 3. Students will raise their hands to speak or to leave their seats. Pencils will be sharpened before class or raise your hand to do so. Hold on to waste papers until the teacher is done with whole group instruction. A recycle bin is also provided by the door. Make sure papers are not crumpled up so that more papers can be recycled.
- 4. When being dismissed, I will dismiss you. (The clock does not dismiss you).
- 5. Eating, drinking liquids other than water, and chewing gum are prohibited during class.
- 6. Assignments are to be submitted on time. Late assignments will drop 20% and will only be accepted at the halfway point of the marking period.
- 7. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to get any assignments missed the day you return to school.
- 8. There will be NO talking during tests or quizzes so that everyone will have an opportunity to do their best.
- 9. If a test is missed and needs to be made up, you will be expected to make arrangements to do so before or after school. If a test is not taken within a week, a zero will result.
- 10. Follow the Student Code of Conduct. Cell phones or electronic devices are permitted to be used only for educational purposes. If you have items from another class, they must be placed on the ground.
