Grade 7 Syllabus

Ms. Beydoun 2018-2019

This class values thinking. The more you think, talk, and write about your thinking, the better your grade will be. There may be wrong answers, but there are NEVER wrong ideas.

Course Description: Seventh Grade English Language Arts fosters critical thinking through the study of reading literature, writing, listening, collaboration, and presentation skills. Students will utilize vocabulary and reading strategies to evaluate fiction and nonfiction texts. They will write for a variety of audiences and purposes and their writing will serve as an anchor for lessons in language and grammar use. Students will demonstrate appropriate presentation skills, as well as listen to, view, analyze and evaluate information using various best practices.

Requirements and Expectations:

I. Needed materials

- A. Binder 1"or 2" (set up second week of school): There will be regular binder checks in my class for a grade
- B. TAB Dividers- Three
- C. Binder Pouch
- D. Sharpened Pencils, Sharpener, Erasers
- E. Highlighters
- F. Washable Markers, colored pencils (Creative projects that are required to be colored are assigned often in this course)
- G. At least two packs of loose-leaf lined paper
- H. Composition Book (will be creating an interactive journal second semester)
- I. Note-cards, reinforcement labels (Recommended)
- J. Writing utensils- MUST HAVE blue/black and red ink pens
- K. Post-its, glue sticks, scissors, rulers, sharpeners, hole punchers, and personal staplers are used often in my class. Project supplies are great to have at home to complete in class assignments that might end up as homework.
- L. Reader's Workshop/Independent Reading book (class or school library): Students must **ALWAYS** have a book/educational magazine of personal preference available to read.

II. Work to expect

- A. We will use various types of literature to analyze across genres, literary texts and informational texts. We will also read independently, books of your own choice, in class and for homework daily.
- B. We will cover as much literature relevant to issues in our society as possible.
- C. We will have rich discussions whose aim is to foster thinking and writing and build a strong and cohesive class community.
- D. We will write compositions OFTEN! Some will be writing contests; others will be essays and journal entries.
- E. We will practice grammar and punctuation through daily SLOT routines
- F. We will do word studies as we read and write.
- G. We will interpret and write poetry.

- H. We will watch movies which relate to course materials (some of which are PG-13). Please pay attention to the check-box below if your child cannot watch course-related PG-13 movies.
- G. We will amend this syllabus and any other assignments on an "as needed" basis to foster growth in areas most needed.

III. Late, incomplete or incorrect assignments and Exam Retakes:

Part of your grade will be based on following directions and completing assignments on time. You will lose points if you do not comply. Absences will require makeup work to be done in a timely fashion. It is your responsibility to ask me **alongside using Google classroom and email me** for missing work when absent. You have one day to turn in an assignment after an unexcused absence. Our school handbook addresses rules on absences. As for unexcused late submissions of formative assignments, you will lose 1 point for each day it is late. **After 4 days late, your assignment will be worth half-credit.**

*Exam make-ups if absent are only offered within 1 week from the original testing date. You are responsible for letting me know you need to retake a test or quiz within this one week span.

IV. Plagiarism and cheating

- A. Copying of any sort—from another student's work, from the internet, or from literature—will result in a zero. An alternative assignment will be done for a grade no higher than 70%. (Copying of this sort is often called plagiarism.)
- B. Cheating on a test will result in a zero.
- C. There will also be an office referral for the above infractions.

VI. Discipline Plan/Reward System

PBIS stands for Positive Behavior Intervention Support. It is a program designed to teach respect, responsibility, and safety at our school. The PBIS Matrix is a guide to help us remember what consequences we will receive for faulty behavior. PBIS also offers celebration for our positive behavior choices. One of which includes the opportunity to earn Dojo points using ClassDojo. See attached sheet for more on this.

VII. **Assessments:** Students will receive both formative and summative assessments.

- * Formative assessment is the ongoing assessment of each student aimed at providing information to guide teaching and improve student performance. Therefore, students will be consistently assessed either orally or in writing to ascertain whether learning and progress are taking place.
- Summative Assessment is the collective assessment for a unit of study. It is designed to provide a grade indicating whether a student has made progress and learned sufficient information to move on to the next level of performance.

Summative Assessments (Tests, Projects, some quizzes, final compositions, etc...) will account for 70% of a student's grade, while formative assessments (daily work, homework, drafts, participation) will average close to 30%.

Some ways to earn points as a collective group are to be helpful to one another during team assignments, hold a growth mindset when tasks appear difficult, and most importantly, demonstrate respect to guest teachers when Ms. Beydoun is not in the room.

O.L. Smith Cell Phone, Electronic Accessories, and Devices Policy

O.L. Smith will enforce a red and green zone cell phone policy. The hallways, cafeteria, and outside the building are considered green zones where cell phone usage is allowed ONLY when the time permits. **Green Zone times are anytime before 7:50 and after 2:55.** ALL CLASSROOMS ARE CONSIDERED RED ZONES, unless the classroom teacher makes it a green zone for educational purposes. When the teacher indicates it is a red zone, all phones need to be turned off and out of sight. All school offices are always a red zone. Students may have their cell phones on them, but if their phones cause any type of audible or visual distraction, the phone will be confiscated by the teacher.

To eliminate distractions, disruptions, academic dishonesty and theft, we expect parents to respect the educational process by not texting or calling their child during the school day. If there is a family emergency, parents should call the school at 313-827-2800. The following disciplinary actions will occur for students who do not adhere to the policy:

FIRST OFFENSE: Teacher will confiscate phone and send it to the office and a phone call home will be made by office staff. As long as the student was cooperative and respectful, he/she will receive the phone at the end of the day from the office.

SECOND OFFENSE: The student may still come to the office; however, a parent/guardian listed on the emergency card with proper identification must accompany them at the end of the day to retrieve his/her phone.

THIRD OFFENSE: The parent/guardian listed on the emergency card with proper identification must come in and retrieve the phone from the office and the student will receive **1 hour** of detention, lunch detention, or community service .

FOURTH OFFENSE: All consequences of the third offense, plus additional hours of detention, lunch detention or community service, along with administrative intervention.

SMITH WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST OR STOLEN CELL PHONES OR ELECTRONIC DEVICES.

REFUSAL TO COMPLY WHEN ASKED TO SURRENDER PHONE TO ANY STAFF MEMBER STUDENT WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE REFERRED TO OFFICE: The student will be given one more chance to turn the phone over to the office providing profanity and threats are not used with staff involved, and the parent/guardian will be notified of the insubordinate behavior. The student will be required to attend a restorative session. A behavior contract will be developed with the student.

<u>TEACHERS:</u> All cell phones that are confiscated need to be turned into the student office before the end of the day.
