Supplies:

Students will be required to come to class prepared to work. This means that I will expect students to have **paper, pencil or pen and their text book**. Students should make sure that they have a **binder or folder used solely for this class**. All papers should be labeled according to class policy. Corrected papers handed back to students should be kept through the end of each semester in their class binder/folder. If there is a dispute over a grade entered and the paper has been handed back, it is the STUDENTS responsibility to provide proof that a mistake was made.

Chromebooks:

Retakes:

Students will be allowed to do re-takes only if all work for that chapter has been turned in, the absence was excused, and a minimum of 2 hours of after school tutoring was completed for the test they are retaking. Only tutoring sessions offered by Fordson are acceptable.

Participation Sheet:

Each card marking, students are asked to participate in class discussion a minimum of 6 times. Participation will be worth 60 summative points per card marking.

Responsibility Points:

Each student will begin the semester with 75 responsibility points. You will not lose any points the first 2 times you are tardy. You will lose 5 points for each tardy 3-6. From your 7th tardy on, you will lose 10 points for each tardy. You may also lose points for not being prepared for class or for being a disruption. These are "free" points. In order to keep them, you simply have to show up on time and be prepared!
