In Fed. 10 James Madison explains that Majority Factions will overpower minority factions and prevent any representation of the minority. He states that there should be several factions so that there is many ideas and many agendas. Allowing Factions to flourish will make sure one faction does not claim all the power. This would prevent Majority Factions from taking over and protect all the citizens' liberties.

The Federalist had a better plan for protecting citizens' liberties because they fought for a central gov't with divided powers. In Fed 51, the author writes about a gov't that is divided but equal and is able to check on the other part of gov't. The different parts of gov't would only be able to elect officials for other parts of gov't.
