freshwater island.



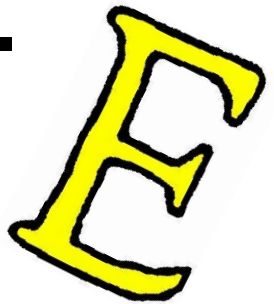
kid 2: Lake Ontario is the

kid 4: Lake Erie is the fourth largest Great Lake in surface area, and the smallest in depth. Because it's so shallow, it is the warmest of the Great Lakes, but it also freezes over more than the others.



kid 5: Lake Superior is the largest
of the Great Lakes, and it's so
big that it can contain all of the
other Great Lakes combined,
plus three more the size of
Lake Erie.
