- 6. Caesar asks, "What, Brutus?" What is his real meaning?
- 7. Caesar says, "But I am as constant as the Northern Star" (863). What is his meaning at this point in the play?
- 8. What does Caesar ask just before dying?
- 9. Brutus says, "Ambition's debt is paid" (864). What does he mean?
- 10. Brutus says Caesar shall bleed in sport. What does he mean?
