

Book Log Bingo

1. Choose ONE of the following items and complete it based on your weekly reading. Your answer needs to be **thorough and in complete sentences**.
2. **Book Log SSR Binder tab:** You will keep all of your Bingo writings in this divider when it is returned to you. Keep track of which Bingo Squares you have completed by using this sheet. You may NOT do a square twice.

1. Summary/retelling: Summarize or re-tell the portion of the book you read today. Answer the 5 Ws: Who, What, Where, When, and why. Also tell why you decided to summarize that particular part.	2. Create a character list: Who are the characters? What are they like (adjectives)? What did they do to make you describe them in that way?	3. Prediction: Predict what will happen in the future in the book, both short-term (next chapter) and long-term (end of the book). You need to include both.	4. Feelings: How does the book make you feel? Why does it make you feel that way? How do the characters in the book feel? Why do they feel that way?
5. Visualization Find a descriptive passage from your book that gives you a clear picture in your head. Hint: It should include several adjectives. 1. Copy the passage down by quoting it. "He slowly treaded through the green, murky pond." 2. Using blank paper and crayons, colored pencils, draw a picture.	6. Vocabulary Find 5 unfamiliar words that you would like to learn to pronounce, use correctly, and understand. List the words, look them up in a dictionary, copy them down with their definitions, check with me for pronunciation, and use them in sentences.	7. Character you love and a character you hate: You must complete BOTH of the following: 1. Tell about a character you love and why you feel so positively about him or her. 2. Tell about a character you hate and why you feel so negatively about him or her. Be specific when stating why.	8. Critique: Write about a decision the author made that you agree with or disagree with. • Why did you like it or not like it? • Why do you think the author made that decision? • What would you have done differently if you had been the author?
9. Lesson Learned: What lesson(s) can you learn from the author? What in the story is teaching you that lesson?	10. The book and me: Write about an event or a character in the book that reminds you of your life. • What happened in the book? • What happened in your life? • How are they connected?	11. Text Connections: Write about an event or a character in the book that reminds you of another book you have read. • What happened in this book? • What happened in the other book? • How are they connected?	12. Questions: What sort of questions do you have as you read the book? Write down 3-5 questions. Answer each question using your own options/ideas as you read.
13. Conflict: Describe the conflict in the book. • Who does it involve? • Into which category does this conflict fit? 1. Man vs. man 2. Man vs. self 3. Man vs. society • Explain why it fits that particular category.	14. Poems and lyrics: Find song lyrics or a poem that somehow reminds you of this book. Write about the connection you make between the song/poem and your book. Include a copy of the poem or the lyrics.	15. Metaphor and Simile: Find a metaphor or simile in your book and explain its use. • What does it mean? • Why do you think the author used it?	16. Book Jacket This is a required square. After you complete the book, you must create your own book jacket for your portfolio. • Cover: Title, author and picture (DIFFERENT from actual book) • Back: Your OWN summary of the book • Inside: Bingo sheet and logs
