

ADULT DAY CARE

Adult Day Care Centers are designed to provide care and companionship for seniors who need assistance or supervision during the day. The program offers relief to family members or caregivers and allows them the freedom to go to work, handle personal business or just relax while knowing their relative is well cared for and safe.

The goals of the programs are to enhance self-esteem and to encourage socialization. There are two types of adult day care: adult social day care and adult day health care. Adult social day care provides social activities, meals, recreation and some health-related services. Adult day health care offers more intensive health, therapeutic and social services for individuals with severe medical problems and for those at risk of requiring nursing home care.

MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES (MDHHS)

CASH ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Family Independence Program (FIP)

The main goal of FIP is to help families become selfsupporting and independent.

FIP is temporary cash assistance for low-income families with minor children and pregnant women. FIP helps them pay for living expenses such as rent, heat, utilities, clothing, food and personal care items.

FIP applicants and recipients may be assigned to Partnership Accountability Training Hope (PATH) for assistance in finding a job or to develop needed job skills. Help with transportation, childcare and other needs related to employment and training may be provided.

FIP Eligibility Requirements

48-month lifetime limit:

You cannot receive FIP for more than 48 months in your lifetime unless you qualify for an extension or an exception. Months before October 2007 do not count. Months do not count if you are:

- Deferred.*
- Working and following your Family Self-Sufficiency Plan.*
- Live in a county with a high unemployment rate.
- Follow Work Rules and Penalties.

State Disability Assistance

The State Disability Assistance (SDA) program provides cash assistance to disabled adults to help them pay for living expenses.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) is a cash benefit to needy persons who are aged (at least 65), blind or disabled. It is a federal program administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA). States are allowed the option to supplement the federal benefit with state funds. In Michigan, SSI benefits include a basic federal benefit and an additional amount paid with state funds.

CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES

Eligibility for Child Support Services

Child Support services in Michigan are available to:

- Parents of minor children, when one parent does not live with the child
- Parents who pay court-ordered child support
- Persons who have physical custody of a minor child
- Persons who receive public assistance for a minor child living in their home. Except in certain specific cases, these individuals automatically receive child support services

Available Child Support Services

The following child support services are available in Michigan:

- Assistance with application for child support services
- Locating parents
- Establishing paternity
- Establishing court orders for support
- Establishing court orders for custody and parenting time
- Collecting and processing child support payments
- Modifying support court orders
- Enforcing court orders for support

Child Care

For many families, the cost of safe, quality child care is a major strain on the budget. DHHS Child Development and Care Program may provide payment for child care services for qualifying families when the parent, legal guardian or substitute parent is unavailable to provide the child care because of employment, education and/or because of a health/social condition for which treatment is being received.



MDHHS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

State Emergency Relief (SER)

The State Emergency Relief (SER) Program provides immediate help to individuals and families facing conditions of extreme hardship or for emergencies that threaten health and safety.

The SER program is primarily designed to maintain low-income households who are normally able to meet their needs but occasionally need help when unexpected emergency situations arise. The SER program is not an appropriate solution to ongoing or chronic financial difficulties.

HOME HELP SERVICES

Home Help program provides personal care services to Medicaid eligible individuals who need hands-on assistance with Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) and assistance with Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs).

HOUSING DISCRIMINATION

Housing Discrimination is more than a refusal to rent, sell or finance housing. With few exceptions, the law prohibits the following acts when based on race, color, religion, sex, national origin, familial status, disability, age, marital status, sexual orientation, student status, or source of income:

 Steering people and families to or away from a particular neighborhood or a certain part of an apartment complex;

- Charging a higher security deposit or offering different terms and conditions, use of facilities, or other services associated with the rental, sale or financing of housing;
- Having different qualifying standards, such as closer scrutiny of credit history for some groups while bending the rules for others;
- Saying that housing is not available to view, buy, or rent when it is in fact available;
- Sexual harassment by an owner or agent;
- Harassment of buyers or renters who are exercising their fair housing rights.
 Harassment of sellers, rental agents, or real estate agents who refuse to discriminate.

You can only certify with MARVIN after you file for Unemployment Insurance Benefits. MARVIN is available Monday – Saturday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. You may call anytime during your reporting week.

How can I have my unemployment benefits directly deposited into my bank account?

UIA now issues unemployment benefits electronically - direct deposit into a bank or credit union account or through the Michigan UI Debit Card. Workers select their payment option as they apply for benefits. If no choice is made, the worker will automatically receive the UI debit card. The payment option can be changed at any time by calling UIA's toll-free claims line 1-866-500-0017 (select Option #2) or by creating a free online web account at the UIA Web site (www.michigan.gov/uia). To create the web account users should click on the link entitled "On-line Services for Unemployed Workers." The online web account will also give them access to a history of their unemployment benefit payments.



I changed my payment option (debit card or direct deposit). Did it go through?

Individuals can see if the payment option has changed by checking their free UIA online web account (see answer above).

What else can I do to get help with my unemployment claim?

Focus

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) provides participants with workforce investment activities that increase employment, retention, earnings and occupational skill attainment which improves the quality of the workforce, reduces welfare dependency, and enhances the productivity and competitiveness of the economy.

Description

The local Michigan Works! Agencies (MWAs) operate adult programs on a year-round basis. The funds allocated to the MWAs for the adult program must be used to support core, intensive, and training services.

Basic Career Services

Basic career services are available to all dislocated workers and may include: Program information and basic assessment, general information, individual job development, advanced job club, advanced screened referrals, group activities, job search.

Individualized Career Services

Individualized career services are designed for dislocated workers who have been unable to obtain employment through core services and have been determined to be in need of more individualized services. Individualized career services may include: Comprehensive specialized assessment, individual employment planning, counseling, short-term prevocational skills, case management, literacy activity, out of area job search, relocation assistance, internship and work experience.

Training Services

Occupational skills training, On-the-Job training, workplace training with related instruction, registered apprenticeship, incumbent worker training, pre-apprenticeship training, skill upgrading and retraining, entrepreneurial training, transitional jobs, adult education and literacy training provided in combination with any other training services.

Eligibility

An individual must be 18 years of age or older, a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen and registered with Selective Service (if applicable) to receive services under the adult program, with priority given to: recipients of public assistance, other low income individuals and individuals who are basic skills deficient. Career services (basic and individualized) under the adult program are available to adults who are employed or unemployed, and are unable to obtain employment or retain employment that leads to self-sufficiency. Training services may be made available to employed or unemployed adults who have met the eligibility criteria under training services, and have been determined to be unable to obtain or retain employment through career services.

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
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




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
