<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Toys/Activities</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Song: “Let it Go” from Frozen ● Toy Cars ● Balloon (let it fly around room) ● Freeze dance (stop the music and have student request “go”) 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Social Focus</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Playing structured stop and go games with peers (i.e. red light green light or freeze dance) is a great way to practice “go”. You can even have the winner be “it”, to practice more peer-to-peer interaction.
