- 1. Is the phone call home definite proof that Adams is dead? Why?
- 2. In lines 80-81 ["I was in excellent spirits. The drive ahead of me, even the loneliness, seemed like a lark."], Adams says that he is looking forward to the drive, even to the loneliness. In what way is this example of foreshadowing also ironic?
- 3. Imagine "The Hitchhiker" not ending with the phone call home but stopping at line 459, "I drove through it ["the great arid mesa country of New Mexico"] with the indifference of a fly crawling over the face of the moon." How would you have continued the story and ended it?
