
Evidence / Elaboration: EVIDENCE	Evidence is missing or evidence provided is only opinion based.	Facts and data given as evidence is irrelevant to the claim. No evidence source is not provided.	General facts and data are given in only 1 or 2 of the body paragraphs and may not be sufficient to support the claim. Evidence source is provided for 1 or 2 pieces of evidence. (i.e. "According to SOURCE,")	Specific facts and data are given in each body paragraph as relevant evidence that is sufficient to support the claim. Evidence source is provided (i.e. "According to SOURCE,")	
Evidence / Elaboration: REASONING	Reasoning is minimal or missing.	Reasoning is included but is only a restatement of the evidence. It is insufficient to clarify the connection between the claim and evidence.	In 1 or 2 of the body paragraphs, reasoning attempts to elaborate on the relationship between the claim and evidence but fails to create cohesion between the claim and evidence.	In all 3 body paragraphs, reasoning effectively elaborates on the relationship between the claim and evidence. Reasoning creates cohesion between the claim and evidence.	
Conventions: SPELLING	4 or more spelling errors are present in the essay.		 3 or less spelling errors are present in the essay. 		
Conventions: PUNCTUATION	4 or more punctuation errors are present in the essay.		 3 or less punctuation errors are present in the essay. 		
Conventions: PRONOUN USAGE	First person pronoun(s) appear in the essay. This does not include first person pronouns used in quotes.		No first person pronouns (I, me, my, we, etc.) are used in the essay. {First person pronouns found in quotes are permissible.}
